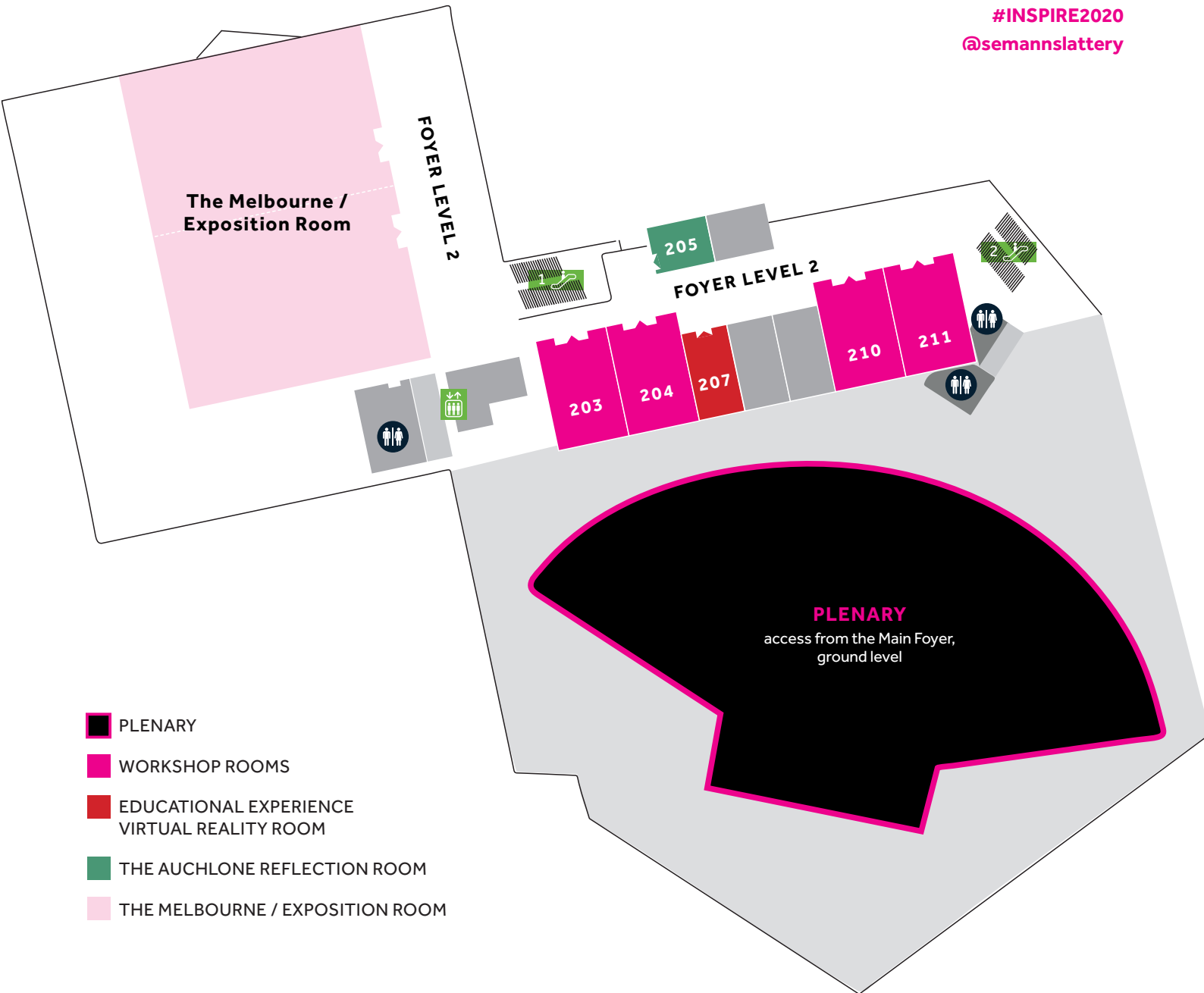
The Educational Experience VIRTUAL REALITY | DR CLAIRE WARDEN'S Auchlone Nature Kindergarten
